ABOUT THE SCHOOL

The Belize STEAM Laboratory School (SLS) is a new, innovative high school located on the ITVET Campus, Freetown Road, Belize City. SLS is currently in a design and development phase.

The principal, vice principal and teachers of the school will collaborate with officers from the Belize Ministry of Education and consultants from Massachusetts Institute of Technology to co-design the school's curriculum, programs, policies, procedures and plans.

Once fully operational SLS will prepare students for existing and future careers through competency-based programs and individualized, authentic learning experiences. It will graduate young people prepared with knowledge, skills, and integrated experiences in arts and science, technology, engineering, mathematics to build a sustainable future for themselves and their communities. It will accomplish this by creating a diverse and inclusive school community that inspires young people, including girls, those from marginalized social, economic or cultural groups and those with special educational needs, to advance their knowledge and understanding of the world and to engage in concrete action that leads to improvement of their own lives and those around them.

ABOUT THE POSITION

The vice principal assists the principal in the effective management of the school's culture, curriculum, campus, staff, students and resources. He or she works as part of a team that includes the school principal, teachers, Ministry of Education officers and external consultants in the co-design of curriculum, policies, procedures and plans.

The vice principal assists the principal with establishing a positive school public profile, ensuring the success of student recruitment and admissions and creating effective school development plans that promote growth and sustained success.

The vice principal assists the principal in managing the school's daily operations with a particular focus on physical, instructional and psycho-social on and off-campus learning environments. He or she plays a key role in the creation of a positive, innovative, dynamic culture and the actualization of the school mission, vision and values through the monitoring and implementation of policies and procedures.

He or she will frequently engage students in design and project oriented, hands-on, individualised learning experiences that synthesise concepts from a range of disciplines.

The KLA teacher consistently promotes STEAM education and the school's mission, vision and values. He or she contributes to the maintenance of a positive school culture reinforced by ensuring compliance with the school's policies, rules and procedures.

The KLA teacher assists the principal and vice principal with establishing a positive school public profile, ensuring the success of student recruitment and admissions and creating effective school development plans that promote growth and sustained success.

The KLA teacher will have opportunities for professional growth e.g. by mentoring colleagues and engaging in the provision of STEAM related capacity building activities for teachers across the country.

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
