Purpose of the Consultancy:	Linkages to Spotlight Initiative:				
	In 2017, The Spotlight Initiative was launched as a global, multi-year initiative by the European Union and the United Nations to eliminate all forms of violence against women and girls (VAWG). This initiative galvanized political commitment at the highest levels and contributed to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically Goal 5 on gender equality, fully integrating the principle of "leaving no one behind".				
	The European Union (EU) and the United Nations (UN) are embarking on a new, global, multi-year initiative focused on eliminating all forms of violence against women and girls (VAWG) - the Spotlight Initiative. The Initiative is deploying targeted, large-scale investments to eliminate all forms of violence against women and girls in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, Latin America, and the Pacific. As such, the Initiative is working with governments and civil society organizations to prevent domestic violence by raising awareness, establishing, and implementing laws and policies and improving quality essential services for survivors. In so doing, the Initiative is placing the elimination of all forms of violence against women and girls at the centre of efforts to achieve gender equality and women's empowerment, in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (SDGs), specifically SDG 5 on Gender Equality.				
	In Belize, the Spotlight Initiative ¹ under the prevention pillar addressed the issue of Comprehensive Sexuality Education through the scale-up of delivery of high quality, age appropriate comprehensive sexuality education programmes for young people, including boys and girls with disabilities, in and out of school to promote gender equality and change negative socio-cultural gender norms that sustain violence against women and girls. This will contribute to ending family violence by strengthening policy and legislations that will lead to increased protection of women and girls, building the capacity of state and non-state actors to respond to family violence, expanding the range of services available and addressing social norms and behaviours that promote violence against women and girls.				
	Revision of HFLE Curriculum				
	Belize currently has a Health and Family Life Education (HFLE) Curriculum established at the primary school level. However, the current version requires updating to reflect the reality of Belize and this revision will allow professional teachers to adopt the curriculum in its entirety to be taught comprehensively in the classroom. SCLAN is seeking a consultant to identify gaps in the current version of the HFLE curriculum through the facilitation of consultations and validation sessions with key stakeholders; and drafting and finalizing the revised Health and Family Life Education Curriculum based on recommendations received from stakeholders. This support will be provided for twenty (20) consultancy days to draft a revised HFLE for approval by the Ministry of Education.

Revision of HFLE Curriculum

- ✓ Inception Report submission outlining context of the current HFLE curriculum, proposed methodological approach, and work plan breakdown structure.
- ✓ Conduct Desk Review of literature (assessments, reports, policies, programme report, legislation on HFLE in Belize and the Caribbean region and other jurisdictions).
- ✓ Conduct sector-specific Key Informant Interviews, particularly with the Ministry of Education and conduct consultation sessions to identify gaps and opportunities in current curriculum.
- ✓ Prepare draft revised HFLE curriculum.
- ✓ Conduct validation sessions with stakeholders.
- ✓ Submit final revised HFLE curriculum.
